

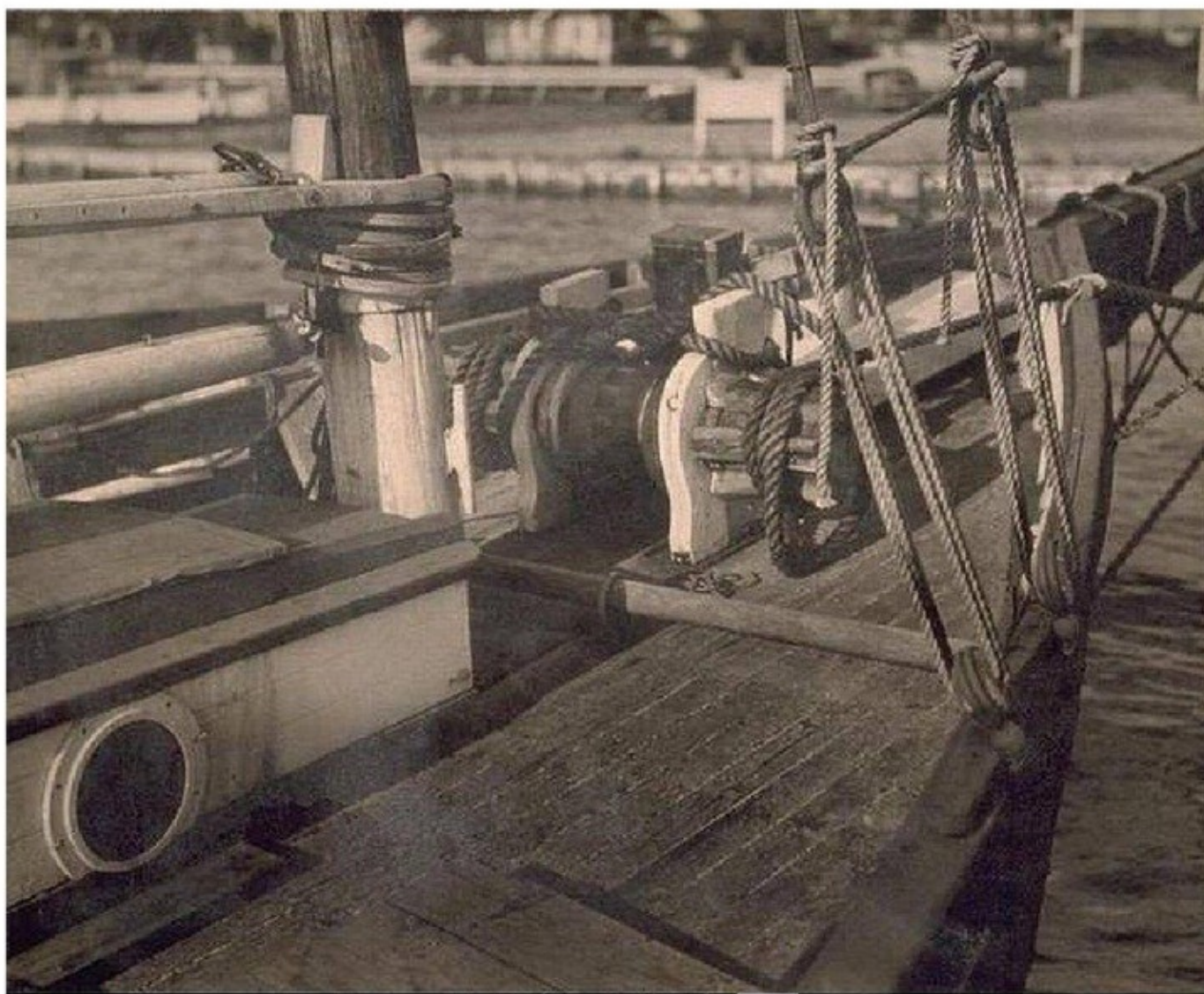


*Stern view of the two-masted schooner Emma C. Berry at wharf.*

*Starboard view of forward deck of the two-masted schooner Emma C. Berry. The trunk cabin, foremast, windlass and rigging are partially visible.*



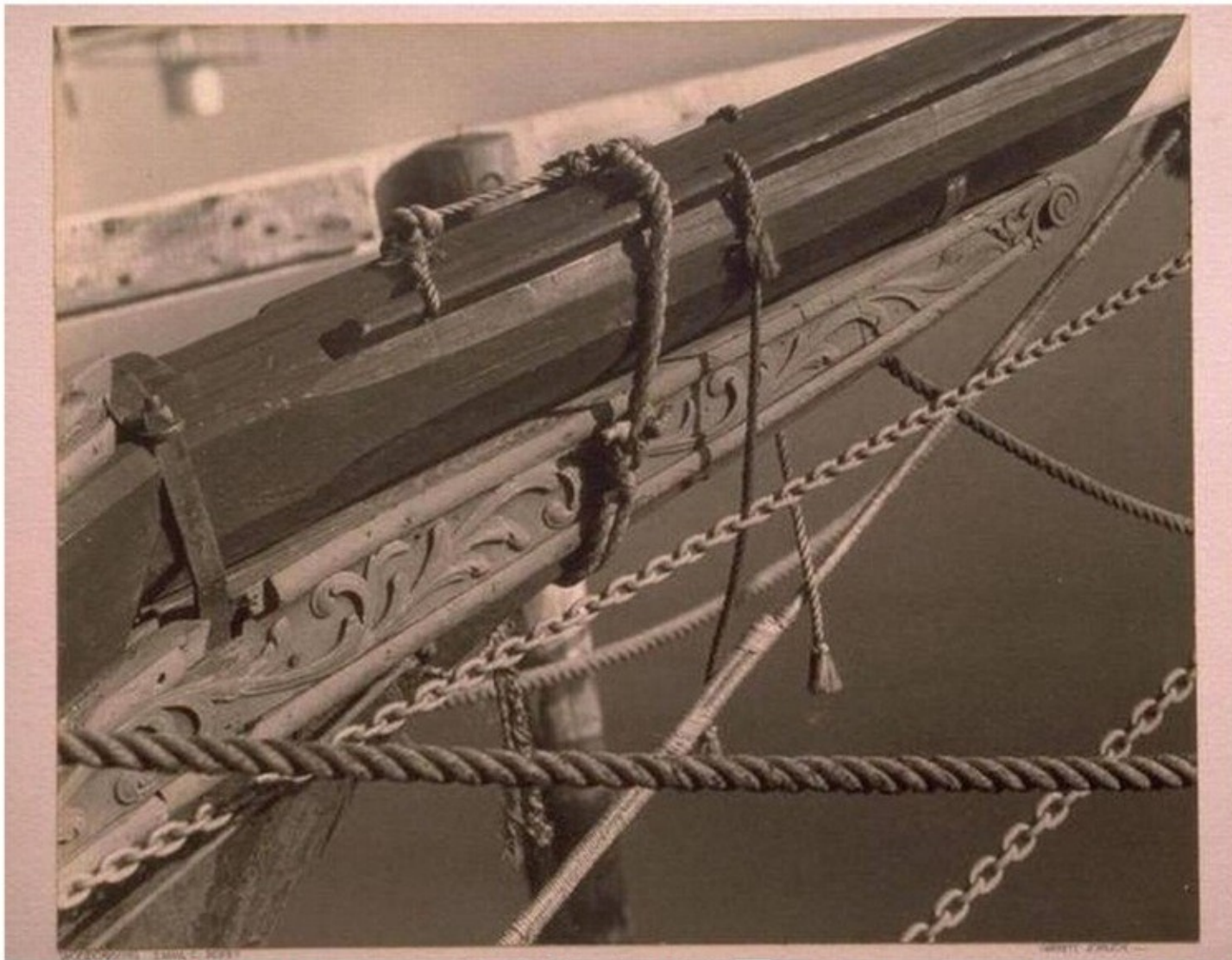

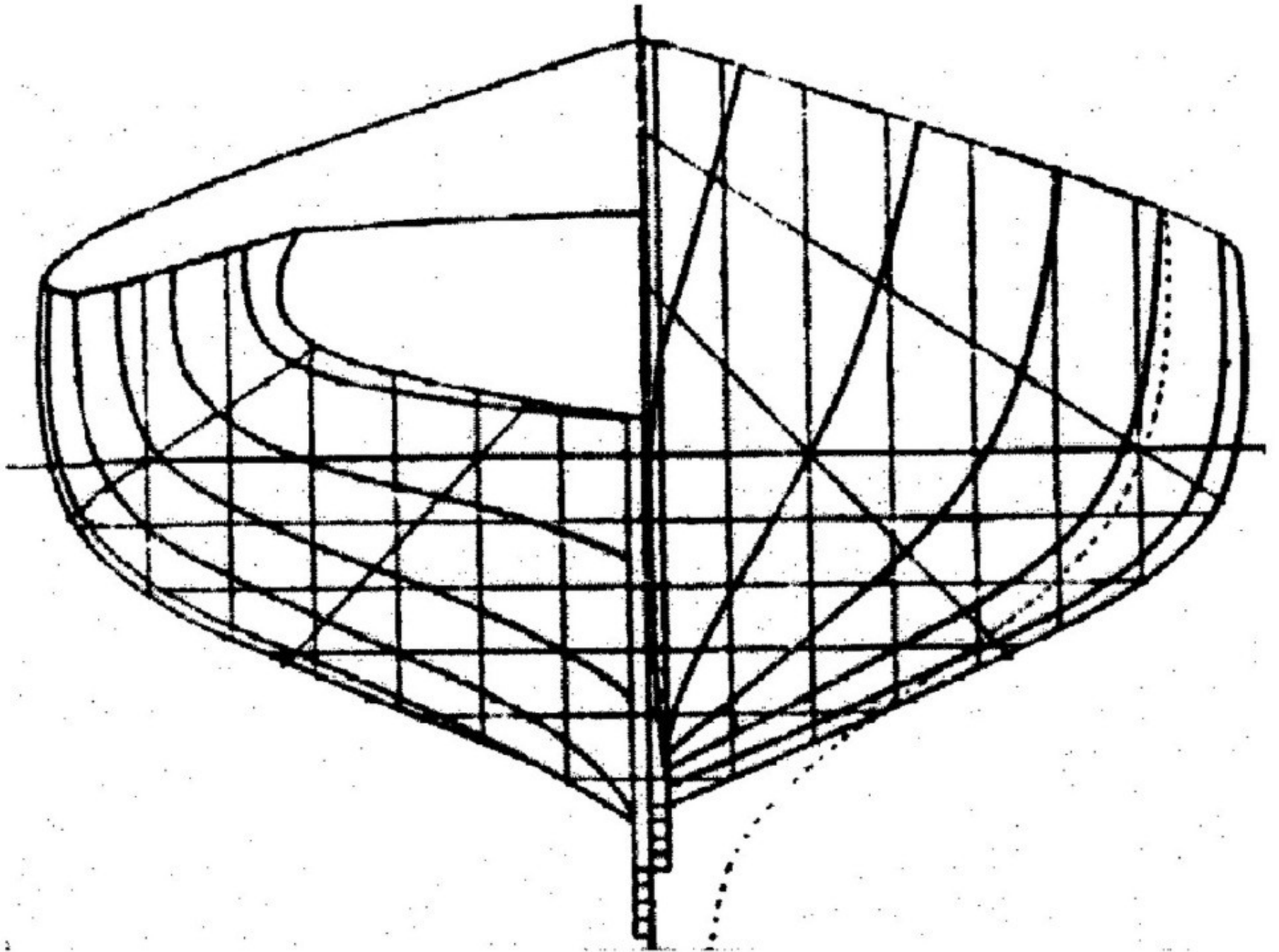


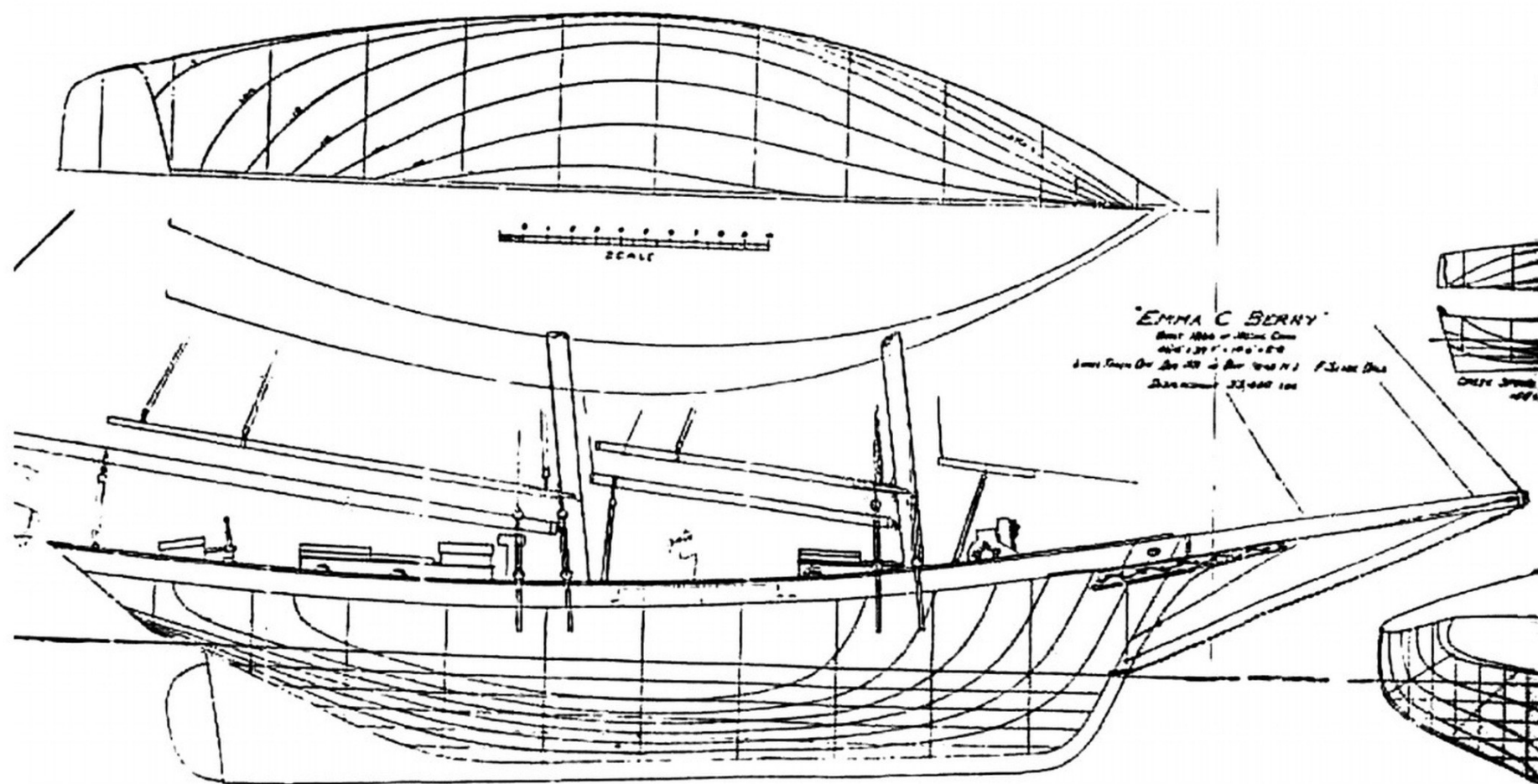


*Rudder of the two-masted schooner Emma C. Berry*

Emma C. Berry was built in 1866. The hull lines shown here appear to have been done in the 30's while it was converted to a cruising schooner. I can just about read Mystic on the drawing. Later when the vessel was brought back to original oyster smack Model Shipways made a scale model of the vessel for sale. I believe the model and plans are still available. This is not the hull station formers used in the Sterling kit. But a good builder could incorporate them.
